LETTER FROM THE FOUNDER & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



As we reflect on another year of challenges and political headwinds, the accelerating pace of global warming is undeniable. Climate extremes—wildfires, floods, and droughts—are becoming the new normal, straining ecosystems and communities. While the causes are complex, one truth is clear: greenhouse gas emissions and poor ecosystem management are intensifying these disasters.

At the Global Warming Mitigation Project, we remain steadfast in identifying and scaling climate solutions. Since 2018, we have awarded \$2.25 million to 70 organizations across 125 countries, helping our laureates secure an additional \$2.42 billion to amplify their impact. Our Keeling Curve Prize, Constellations Fellowship, and Climate Impact Conduit continue to drive innovation, foster partnerships, and empower climate leaders.

Yet, the urgency of this crisis demands more —more collaboration, investment, and bold action. The solutions we champion, from renewable energy to financial system shifts, are not just ideas but actionable steps to mitigate catastrophe. In 2025, we must redouble our efforts, push past policy setbacks, and drive a global shift in how we interact with our planet.

The road ahead is tough, but the opportunity to lead is here. The time to act is now.



KEELING CURVE PRIZE HIGHLIGHTS

In 2024, our seventh year of recognizing impactful climate solutions, the Keeling Curve Prize reached our quota of 500 applications and expanded our global reach, receiving submissions from 79 countries. With a track record of elevating hundreds of climate solutions worldwide, the number of high-quality applications underscores the growing global demand for climate solutions. The Keeling Curve Prize has become one of the world's leading amplifiers for climate focused progress.

CLIMATIZE SEES SURGE IN INVESTMENTS FOLLOWING KEELING CURVE PRIZE RECOGNITION

The impact of the Keeling Curve Prize extends far beyond the award itself—just ask Climatize, one of our 2024 Finance Prize winners. Shortly after receiving the prize, Climatize was mentioned in environmentalist Bill McKibben's newsletter, where he highlighted the platform as a Keeling Curve Prize-endorsed solution for individuals looking to invest in clean energy.

The result? In just 24 hours, Climatize saw over \$100,000 in new investments flow into its renewable energy projects. By the end of the weekend, that number had surpassed \$400,000—demonstrating the power of credibility and validation in accelerating climate solutions.

"As we shared in our application, we knew that an affiliation with the Keeling Curve Prize would be a key validation to help us scale," Climatize shared. "The support from GWMP has been invaluable, and we are so grateful to be part of this community. It truly takes a village to succeed."

This success story underscores the Keeling Curve Prize's ability to amplify high-impact climate solutions, driving real investment and action in the fight against climate change.





Omotola Sanni, a dedicated climate advocate from Lagos, Nigeria, has always been deeply connected to the environmental challenges facing her community. Growing up in a city with stark seasonal changes, she witnessed firsthand the effects of climate change, which fueled her passion for climate action. Her journey led her to the Global Warming Mitigation Project (GWMP), where she became a Constellations Fellow, collaborating with others to develop science-driven solutions that accelerate decarbonization and environmental restoration.

As part of her fellowship, Omotola worked closely with Climatize, an organization focused on democratizing climate finance. This experience not only allowed her to contribute meaningfully to scaling climate solutions but also opened new professional doors. Her impactful work with Climatize during the fellowship ultimately led to a full-time job, marking a significant milestone in her career. Omotola's story highlights how determination, collaboration, and access to the right opportunities can transform passion into lasting impact in the fight against climate change.

CLIMATE IMPACT CONDUIT

The Climate Impact Conduit has made significant strides this year, most notably with the addition of Alex Ballasiotes, who joined GWMP in July as Director of Climate Finance. A key achievement has been restructuring and standardizing eight years (including 2025) of Keeling Curve Prize applications and survey data. Supported by a grant from the Cisco Foundation, this effort transformed fragmented records into a consistent, queryable dataset—improving completeness, timeliness, and usability for meaningful analysis and stronger engagement with corporate and investor partners.

We also refined the 2025 Keeling Curve Prize application to ensure the data collected is better aligned with the Conduit's objectives, enhancing our ability to surface high-impact climate solutions and connect them with funding.

Looking ahead, we are integrating scoring data, building data-sharing partnerships, and creating more targeted opportunities for top-performing applicants—all to further GWMP's mission of catalyzing capital deployment into high-quality climate solutions.

Throughout this year, we've gone through an extensive cleanup process of KCP application data. Some of our findings and key metrics:

127 Countries

97% of applicant organizations are serving at least one underrepresented group*, and 94% are serving multiple

53% are for-profit entities, 40% nonprofit, and 7% other (e.g. government, academia)

72% of applicant organizations reported being led by underrepresented groups

94% of applicant organizations reported serving multiple underrepresented groups

*Youth, women, refugees, minorities, people with disabilities, indigenous communities, economically disadvantaged, or climate-vulnerable communities.


